

## Maidwell Primary School

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011. It was allocated to children who were known to be eligible for free school meals, children who had been looked after continuously for more than six months and pupils from military families. Eligibility for Pupil Premium for 2012-2013 was extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any time in the last six years (known as the *Ever6 Free School Meals Measure*). The extra funding is made available to schools to improve attainment and progress and help overcome barriers to learning. Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they feel appropriate. However, they are accountable for how they use the additional funding to support pupils.

### Pupil Premium 2021-2022

#### Allocation

- The school has 2 pupil premium/post-LAC children registered
- The school's total allocation of Pupil Premium Funding for 2021-2022 is £3690 (+£3690 allowed c/f due to Covid-19)
- Total allocation: **£7380**
